Birth

The late was born on 22nd September 1945 to the late Mzee Jacob Nasokho of the Bayemba Clan and Rebecca Namikoye of the Bamusomi clan at Chebukwabi Kimilili Sub-County. She was the 2nd born among 7 siblings namely Bridgit Nalyaka (the late), Beatrice Nanjala (the late) Imelda Namalwa, Dorothy Nasiondo, Julia Nasokho and Alice Nabalayo.

Baptism/Christianity

She was baptised at Misikhu Parish on 27th April 1960 by Fr. Rahman. She was the Chairlady of CWA (Catholic Women Association) St. Monica Prayer Group.

Education

Agnes went to Kibingei Primary, Kibuk Girls and Kibabii Girls. She excelled in academics, scouting and athletics.

Marriage

Agnes was married to Edward Ngoya of Batukwika Clan in 1965. Their marriage was later formalised on 19th February 1967 at Kibabii Parish. They were blessed with 12 children 8 boys and 4 girls namely Martha(the late), Roselyn, Goddy, Josephine, Vinny, late Mukhwana, late Mulongo, David, Lilian, Ditako, Andrew and Mercy. Step children; Dan, Juliet, Judith, Nancy and Arnest. She was blessed with 32 grand children.

Work/Employment

She worked as a teacher in Kakimani and Eluroyi for about a year. She also practiced farming in maize, sweet potatoes, dairy farming, chicken, and many others. She also operated small business enterprises. She was also the Chairlady of Bukembe Maendeleo Ya Wanawake, Chairlady Tobotia Women Group where she championed women empowerment.

Illness

The late Agnes was born a healthy mom full of life. She has never been hospitalised but had high blood pressure at her late age which she has battled for long. She has complained severally about her legs and knees.

Her health started deteriorating on 29th November 2020 when she developed difficulty in breathing and was rushed to Bungoma Referral Hospital, with the situation she was put on oxygen to boost her breathing and battled for several hours, later in the day at around 3.40pm she succumbed.

Age

The late died at the age of 75 years.
